



Professor Gbolagade Adekanmbi is the Dean of the School of Education, Botswana Open University, and the University's Acting Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academic Services. He currently chairs the African Deans of Education Forum (ADEF). He was once the Acting Director, Centre for Continuing Education, University of Botswana. A Kellogg Visiting Scholar to Syracuse University, USA in 1991, he has made presentations at international conferences and has over eighty publications to his credit. With research interests in adult, distance and higher education, he is a Reviewer for the *International Review of Research in Open and Distributed Learning* (IRRODL), the *Journal of Adult and Continuing Education* (JACE), and the International Academic Forum (IAFOR) *Journal of Education (Studies in Education)*. Professor Adekanmbi obtained his undergraduate and graduate degrees in adult education from the University of Ibadan, Nigeria and has taught courses in adult education, coordinated several distance education programmes, and facilitated several distance education course materials writing workshops.
