D Purpose of Activity

Through this activity, students will learn new vocabulary which they will use in sentences.

- use words and expressions pertaining to the environment.
- D Resources and materials:
  - Board game
  - A dice
  - Pawns

#### Teaching trajectories/ Implementation Guidelines



#### Activity 1: Save the Earth!

- 1. Place the board game on a table and put students in groups.
- 2. Familiarise students with the pictures provided.
- 3. Explain the rules of the game to students:
  - Students take turns to throw the dice.
  - Students move their pawns on the required squares.
  - When playing, the students read aloud the words on the squares on which they fall.
  - They choose the corresponding pictures provided and stick them on the corner of each square.
  - The winner is awarded with a 'Go Green Badge'.



#### **Activity 2: Path-following Recycling Puzzle**

- 1. Explain Activity 2, the Path-following Recycling Puzzle, to students.
- 2. Discuss the term recycle and the purpose of recycling bins.
- 3. Help students to read aloud the list of words provided in the table.
- 4. Explain the meaning of each word.
- 5. Help students to identify pictures provided in the Path-following Recycling Puzzle. Let them guess which recycling bins the pictures lead to.
- 6. Ask students to write the provided words in the corresponding recycling bins with the pictures provided as guidance.

#### For example:

- Metal Recycle Bin Key
- Paper Recycle Bin Books







#### **Activity 3: Composting**

- 1. Guide students to complete Activity 3.
- 2. Show students the compost bin and explain its purpose.
- Ask students to identify the pictures provided on the stickers and to read the words provided aloud.
- 4. Students cut out the stickers and paste them on the compost bin.
- Students fill in the blanks with vocabulary and expressions learnt in Activity 1.



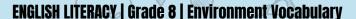
#### **Activity 4: Be Green!**

- 3. Explain the meaning of each word.
- 4. Ask students to identify the pictures provided.
- 5. Students fill in the blanks with the given words.
