F Teaching trajectories/ Implementation Guidelines



Activity 1: Match the flashcards to the pictures

- 1. Distribute the pictures among students.
- 2. Stick the flashcards one by one on the whiteboard.
- 3. Ask the students to stick the pictures near the corresponding flashcards.
- 4. Explain the meaning of the words using the pictures.



Activity 2: Shan's job hunt

- 1. Model the reading while students listen.
- 2. Read the text together with the students.
- 3. Check understanding through questioning.
- 4. Explain the text while focusing on the meaning of key words, phrases and sentences. The pictures may be used again to facilitate understanding.
- While reading the text, students are encouraged to elaborate on the feelings of the character. They may also select an emoji from the emoticon list provided.
- 6. Students answer the questions on the text.
- 7. Students are asked to show the feelings of the character through facial expressions and body movements.



Activity 3: Let's enact

- 1. Provide instructions for the role play, based on the text, which will be carried out in pairs: one student takes the role of Shan and the other acts as the shop manager.
- 2. Teacher models the role play and guides students.
- 3. Students enact the interview scene in pairs in front of the class.

Activity 4: Toy shop scene

- 1. Teacher explains the role play which is a scene in a toy shop between a customer and a shop assistant.
- 2. Students use toys as props for this role play. Teacher discusses details such as the price, size and colour of the toys.
- 3. With the help of the teacher, students draft the script for the role play using the prompts in the table:

Shop Assistant	Customer
How may I help you?	How much is this toy?
There are many interesting toys on offer.	Is there a discount?
This is a new design.	l'll take it. That's a good deal.
Do visit the shop again. Thank you.	Thank you for your help

- 4. One student takes the role of the shop assistant, and another takes the role of the customer.
- 5. Students practise before enacting the scene in front of the class.
- G Assessment:

Enact the scene based on the text provided.

H Extension of activity:

Enact further improvised scenes based on the short text.

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
