



# Purpose of activity

 To invite learners to explore personal and shared memories through music and drama

Students will reflect on how music has shaped their lives and express these stories using performance techniques

The activity fosters empathy, self-awareness, and creative storytelling





- •Use **personal experiences** as inspiration for dramatic performance.
- •Collaborate to **devise a short performance** centered on music and memory.
- •Demonstrate an understanding of how **music** can influence mood, identity, and storytelling.
- •Employ drama techniques such as monologue, tableau, improvisation, and narration.

# Learning Outcomes

## **Resources and Materials**





- Portable music player/speakers
- •Access to music streaming (e.g., Spotify, YouTube)
- •Printed images or recordings for visual reference
- Basic props/costumes
- Pens, paper
- Projector or whiteboard
- •Cameras
- Mobile phones
- •A space to perform and rehearse









## Teaching trajectories/ Implementation guidelines

#### Warm-Up

- Music Memory Circle: Play a 10-15 second clip of several well-known or emotional songs (e.g., "kaya,saya,cassiya").
- After each clip, students share one memory or feeling that the song evokes.
- Emphasize that music is personal, and all responses are valid.

#### **Part 1: Create Your Soundtrack**

- Students write down 3-5 songs that are meaningful to them or their family.
- For each, they note a short memory or feeling associated with it (can be happy, sad, funny, etc.).
- In small groups, students share and discuss their memories.

### **Part 2: Group Devising**

- Each group chooses one memory (their own or someone else's, with permission).
- They devise a short dramatic piece (2-4 mins) that includes:
- a monologue or narration while playing an instrument- tabla, guitar, ravanne, piano, harmonium etc or use of any soundtrack.

#### **Part 3: Performance and Reflection**

After each performance, conduct a short Q&A:

- "What was the story behind the song?"
- "How did the music shape the emotion or action?"



## **Assessment**

- Create a classroom display
   (collage, storyboard, video,
  power point) titled "The Soundtrack
  of Our Lives" with photos, lyrics, and
  quotes from performances.
- Record performances as a video montage set to music.
