Proficiency Level in Subjects

Basic

- Demonstrates emerging interest in learning tasks.
- Achieves some of the foundational learning objectives in Numeracy, Literacy, and Trade & Livelihood skills.

Intermediate

- Shows consistent engagement and motivation in learning activities.
- Achieves at least half of the learning objectives in Numeracy, Literacy, and Trade & Livelihood skills.
- Demonstrates steady progress with the ability to apply learned skills in familiar contexts.

Proficient

- Demonstrates a strong and sustained interest in the subject.
- Achieves more than half of the learning objectives
- Applies knowledge and skills confidently across a range of contexts, showing readiness for the next stage of learning.

The 'Guidelines for Assessment' provides the following information:

- The aims of the assessment
- Components of the assessment
- The planning of the assessment
- The monitoring at school
- The responsibilities of the different stakeholders





Performance criteria

- Performance Criteria have been developed in each subject (<u>Assessment in FPLNS</u>).
- The Performance Criteria should be used by Educators when deciding on the proficiency level attained.
- The Performance Criteria allows a standardization of the evaluation across schools.
- The descriptors are set in a positive language to positively reward students for what they achieve.

Example: Performance criteria in Scientific Literacy

Criteria	Basic	Intermediate	Proficient
Understanding scientific concepts	<u> </u>	Explains simple concepts in own words, may have some inaccuracies.	Explains basic science ideas clearly and links them to real-life situations.
Observation and data Collection	Makes simple observations when guided	Records observations with some independence using words or basic drawings, tables.	Collects accurate observations using appropriate formats with minimal support.
Using scientific terminology	Uses everyday language; rarely uses science terms without prompting	<u> </u>	Uses key science vocabulary correctly in speaking or writing.
Answering Questions	Answers direct questions with short or one-word responses	IIRESPONDS TO WAY OF DOW DIJESTIONS	Gives thoughtful and complete answers; even asks meaningful questions.
Applying knowledge	Recognizes familiar situations but struggles to apply knowledge	Applies known ideas to slightly different contexts with support.	Independently applies basic knowledge to real-life situations.

- Proficiency level is each subject is provided
- Attainment of the award rule

Award Rule

An intermediate level in at least of 4 subjects as follows:

At least two subjects from Cluster 1

+

At least one subject from Cluster 2

+

At least one subject from Cluster 3

Satisfy at least 60% attendance (Possibility of including this criteria to the Award Rules as from 2026 onwards)

Administrative Procedures by the MES

Entry of Students (End of September)

Submission of Results by Schools to the MES (End of October)

Issue of Results (Mid of December)
