Purpose of Information sessions

- ▶ Transitional Year (2025) is over. FPLNS is well-established in schools
- ▶ First in a series of workshops for school management and Educators
- ▶ Dissemination and cascading of up-to-date information
- ▶ Status of FPLNS:
 - Establishment of Teaching and Learning Syllabus
 - Development of Textbooks (85 in all)
 - Training for Educators (Mauritius and Rodrigues)

1. Teaching and Learning Syllabus
2. Teacher's Guide and Student's Workbook
3. Electives for vocational skills development
4. Performance Criteria (competency-based assessment)
5. Student Report Sheet
6. NFCE Award Rule

Capacity-Building and Resources

- ▶ 54 workshops on Electives were held at MIE from 29 April to 29 May 2025 by MIE lecturers and MITD trainers for Educators.
- ▶ Workshops in Rodrigues for Deputy Rectors, Senior Educators, Educators
- ▶ Training conducted for 1829 Educators, 270 D. Rectors and S. Educators and 135 Rectors (Private grant-aided and State Schools from Jan 2025 to June 2025)
- ▶ Workshops on electives in Rodrigues for Educators
- ▶ Initial Grant of Rs 15,000 for FPLNS disbursed in July 2025 to all State (Regional) Secondary Schools, MGSS and Grant-Aided Private Secondary Schools

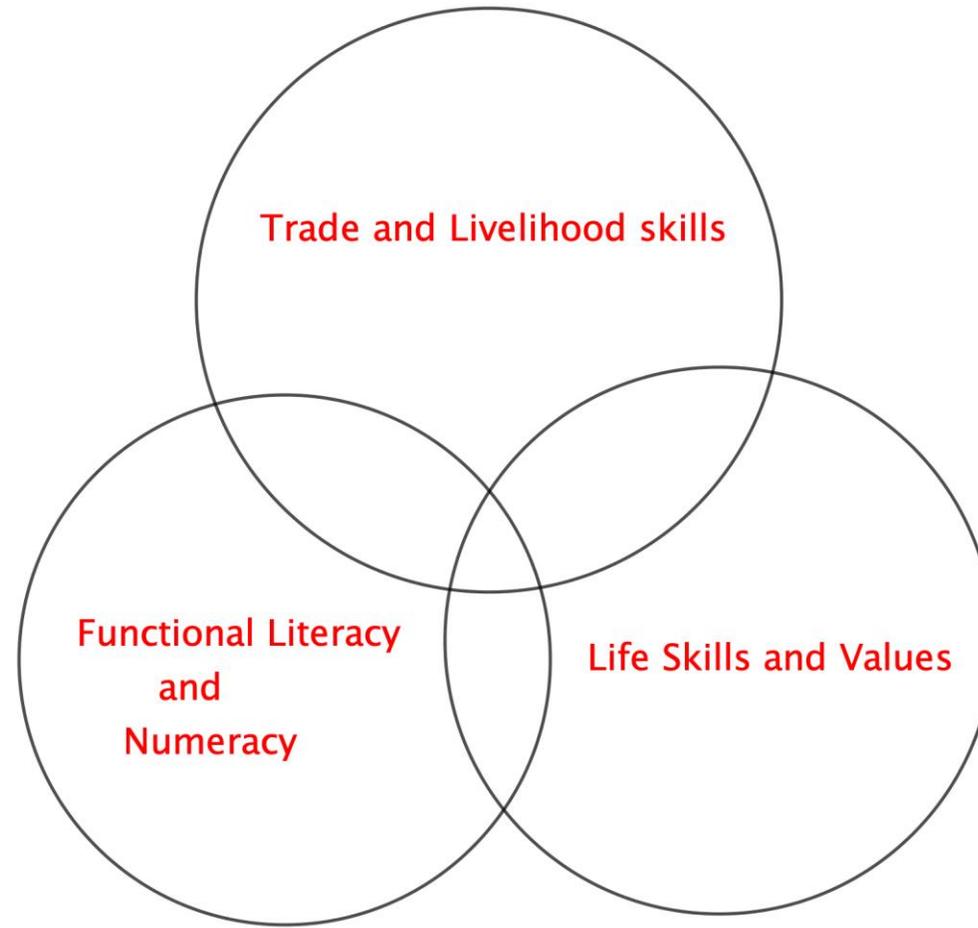

Traditional vs Competency-based curriculum

▶ Traditional curriculum

- ▶ Follows a fixed set of pre-defined content
- ▶ Fixed and structured curriculum
- ▶ Evaluation based on tests/examinations

▶ Competency-based curriculum

- ▶ Focus on mastering pre-defined competencies
- ▶ Flexible curriculum adapted to the needs of the students
- ▶ Evaluation based on continuous demonstration of skills

Performance Criteria: Basic English Literacy

Performance Criteria	BASIC	INTERMEDIATE	PROFICIENT
Read with understanding	Reads, understands and identifies basic vocabulary words related to specific themes.	Reads sentences smoothly to gather relevant information or to complete specific tasks	Reads fluently to extract purpose-driven information
Write coherently	Writes basic vocabulary words correctly.	Write phrases and simple sentences correctly on a specific theme.	Writes simple sentences to form a coherent short paragraph.

- Use ICT for the learning of English language

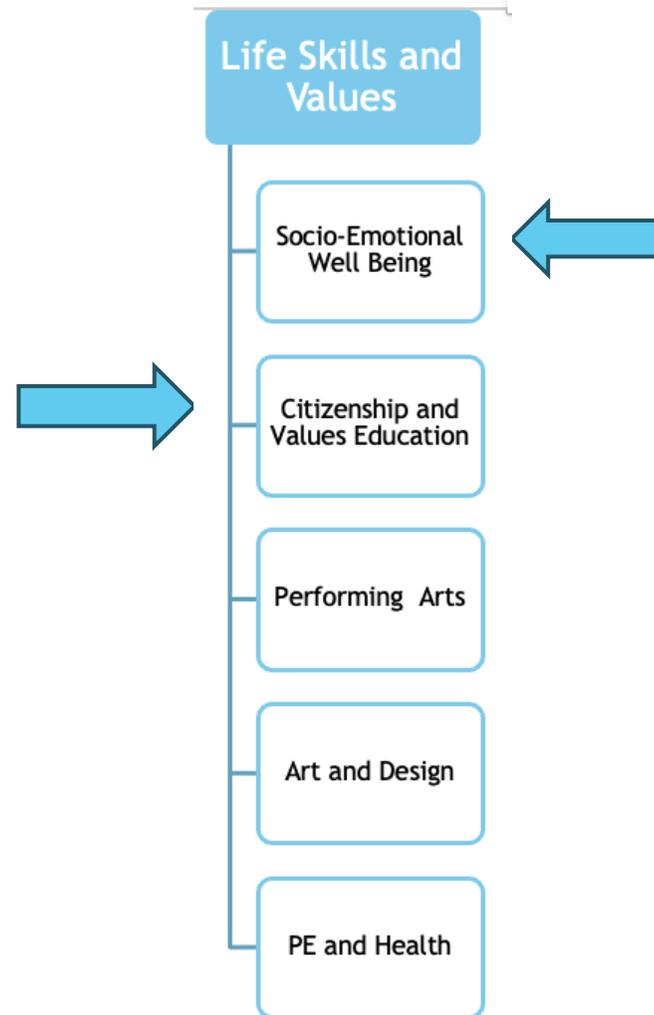
Basic Numeracy

Objectives

By the end of the Foundation Programme, learners will be able to:

1. Recognise, read and write numbers, count and interpret place value.
2. Perform basic arithmetic operations involving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
3. Manage personal finance and maintain a household budget.
4. Apply mathematical concepts to solve simple real-life problems.
5. Solve problems involving measurement and geometry in real-life contexts.
6. Represent and interpret data from charts/graphs in real-life situations.

Socio-Emotional Well-Being

(Self-awareness, self-regulation, motivation, empathy, social skills)

Reflect on their feelings, strengths, and areas for growth to build confidence and a positive self-image

Apply strategies to manage stress or strong emotions during challenging situations



Explain the physical and emotional changes during puberty and demonstrate an understanding of appropriate self-care and hygiene practices.

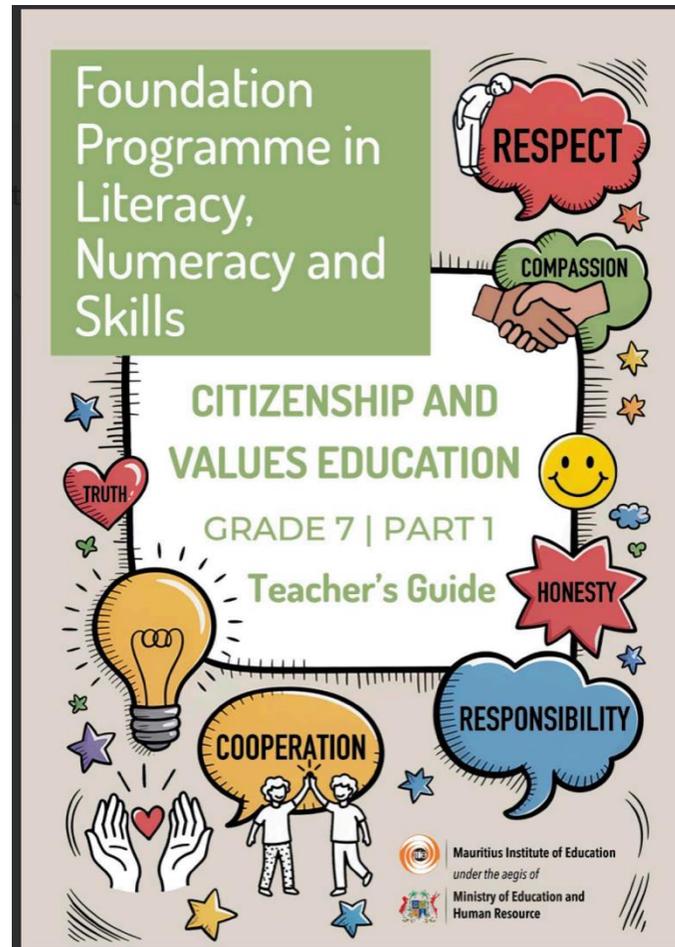

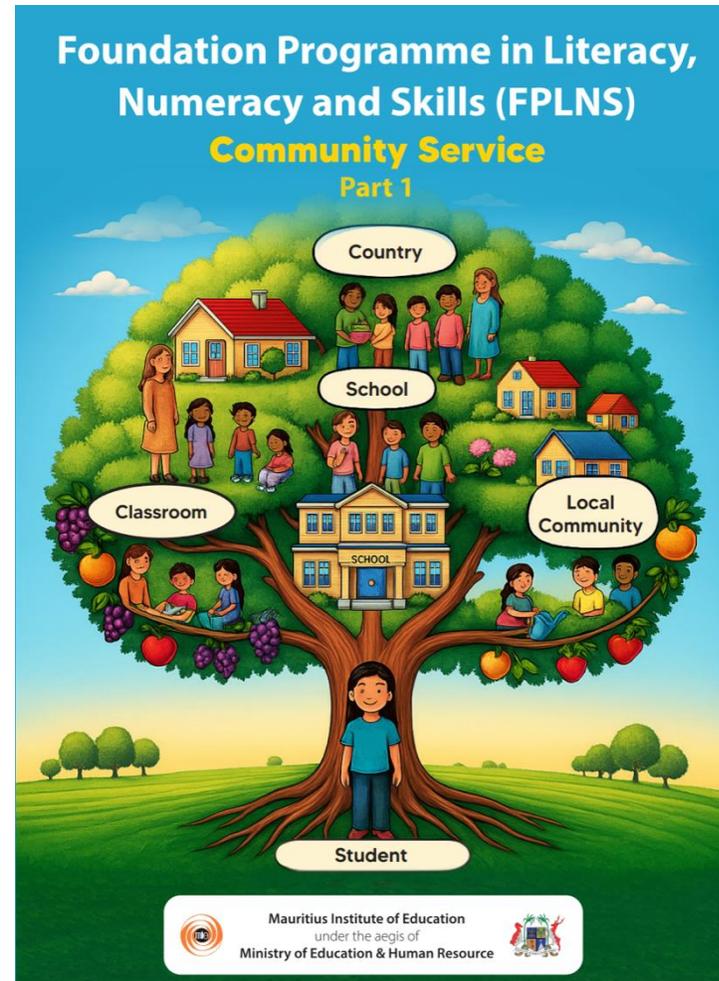

Support for FPLNS Implementation

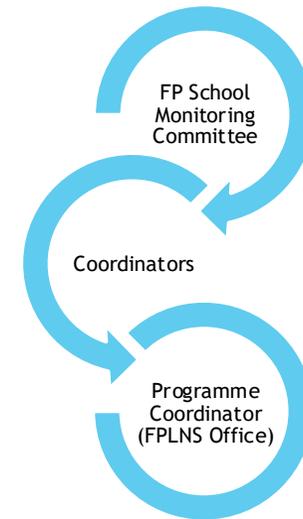


FLE Tutors - Learning Support Tutors

- ▶ FLE Tutors/ Learning Support Tutors from NSIF
- ▶ Learning Support Tutors have been co-opted in the FPLNS programme to provide in-class support to Educators in Literacy and Numeracy. Specifically, they will
 - Assist Educators in the teaching of Literacy-English, Literacy-French and Numeracy
 - Assist in the implementation of electives
 - Assist in the organisation of co-curricular activities

Monitoring Process of FPLNS

- **School Level:** ‘School Monitoring Committee’ led by the Deputy Rector or Senior Educator to oversee the foundation programme and student participation, reporting issues to the Coordinators.
- **Coordinators- HQ/PSEA/MGI:** reports to the Programme Coordinator.
- **National Level:** The Programme Coordinator monitors, designs, and implements the programme, and reports major issues to the Senior Chief Executive and the Permanent Secretary.



The Foundation Programme School Monitoring Committee

- ▶ The Deputy Rector or Senior Educator will chair the committee. The committee will be responsible for:
 - **Monitoring of Teaching and Learning:** Monitor the implementation of the programme at Grades 7, 8 and 9 through meetings.
 - **Monitoring students' progress:** Ensure that Educators use a range of assessments, and the Student Report Sheets are filled.
 - **Monitoring of Student attendance:** Ensure that a proper record of student attendance is compiled.
 - **Support to Educators:** Provide guidance, resources, and identify training needs of Educators.

The Foundation Programme School Monitoring Committee

- **Resource Management:** Ensure that adequate teaching materials, tools, and resources are available to support the programme.
- **Organisation of Co- and extra-curricular activities:** Plan and assist in organization of activities.
- **Communication:** Liaise with responsible parties and other stakeholders for the proper implementation of the programme.
- **Reporting:** Periodically report to the Coordinator through the Head of School.

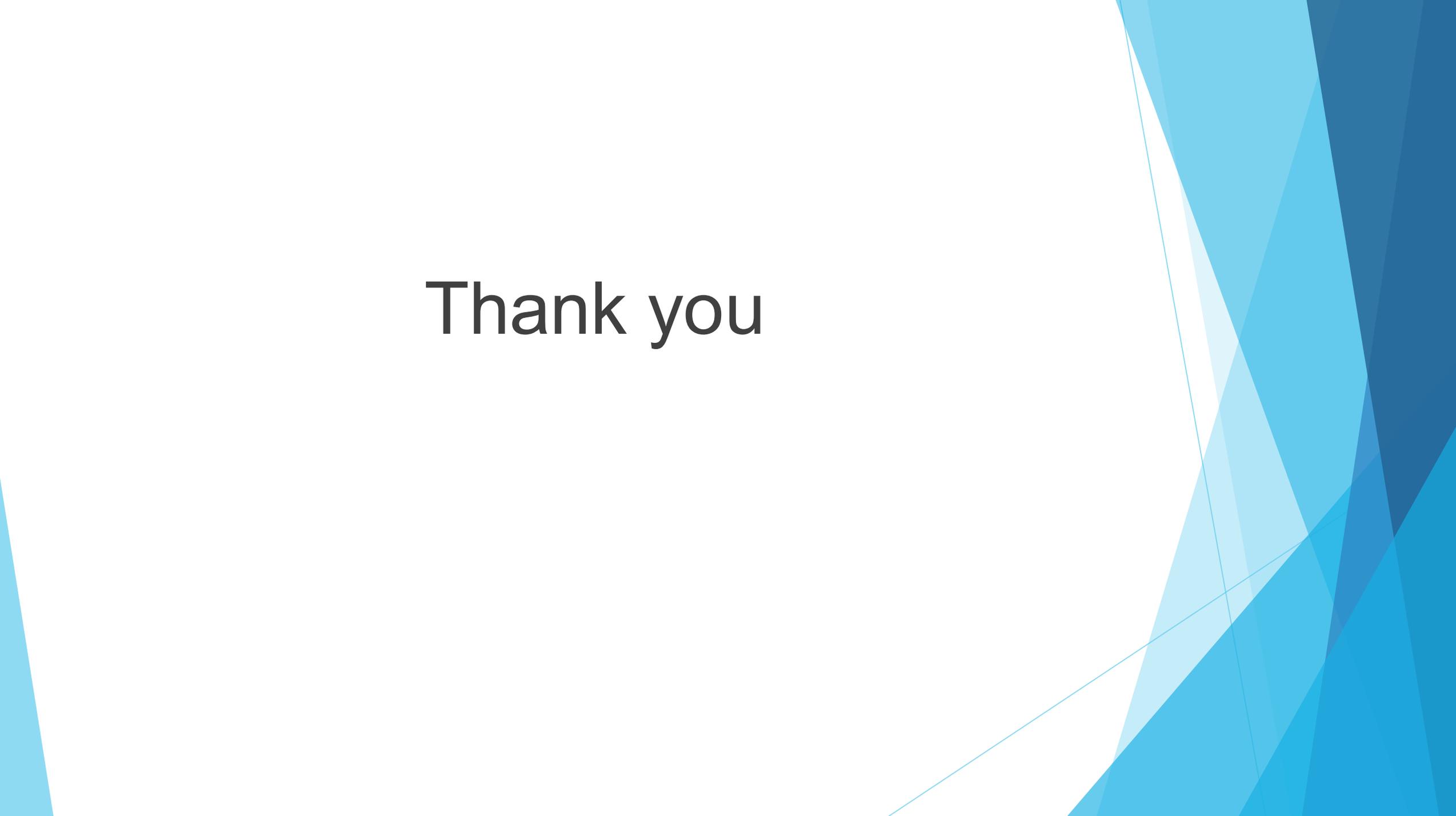
The engagement of School Administrators

- Be positive about the programme and motivate Educators
- Set targets for the students together with Educators
- Meet Educators regularly in FP School Monitoring Committee
- Communication with families
- Ensure that FPLNS is being implemented as per guidelines
- Listen to students and act visibly on at least one of their suggestions

Some suggestions to enhance the engagement of FPLNS students

- Celebrate effort, attendance and improvement
- Exhibit their work
- The electives provide several opportunities to value their work (e.g., Food Preparation and Service, Smart Agriculture, etc)
- School-level certificates for their accomplishment
- Prize giving ceremony
- Bring in local workers or parents to show how the subjects connect to real jobs and life.
- Organise field trips and visits
